An awareness programme on the topic 'Thoothukudi Ecosystem' was organised by the Centre for Eco-feminine Excellence on 21st September, 2023. Mr. D. Christopher, Director of Inspire Techno park, LLP and Mr. Ariganesan, Sanitary Inspector, Thoothukudi Corporation were the resource persons. Dr. N. Arokiya Mary, Associate Professor and Head, Department of Zoology and Director of the Centre for Eco-feminine Excellence welcomed the gathering and introduced the chief guests. The programme was arranged to create an awareness on the perils of plastic waste to the ecosystem Thoothukudi. The resource persons emphasised the

importance of waste segregation at source, that may help the sanitary workers to manage solid waste of Thoothukudi effectively. They gave an insight of how waste disposal is carried out in Thoothukudi. They explained the efforts of Thoothukudi Corporation to establish waste disposal yard and the artificial forest located in Tharuvaikulam, Thoothukudi. Report on invited lecture on 25th September 2023

Report on Health Awareness Programme

lifestyle choices, environmental factors, and genetics in the development of these cancers. Dr. Saroja also stressed the importance of adopting a healthy lifestyle, including a balanced diet, regular exercise, and avoiding tobacco and excessive alcohol consumption.
