Campus Ministry Report 2024-2025 (ODD SEMESTER)

- On June 21, 2024, a one-day orientation programme was held, focusing on the themes of Dare to Lead, Ethical Enlightenment, and Dream to Achieve. The event featured distinguished resource persons, including Rev. Father Arulraj, Administrator and Director of English, Don Bosco College, Keela Eral, Mr. Christo Laurel, Associate Vice President at Guidance Tamilnadu, Mr. Mageswar Radhakrishnan, Associate Vice President at Start Up Tamilnadu and Mr. Jesuraj, Ignatius Butera Guidance Centre, Veerapandiyapattinam who shared their insights and experiences with the students. The programme was wellreceived, inspiring students to lead with integrity, pursue their dreams passionately, and uphold ethical standards in all their endeavors.
- A two-day orientation programme for faculty members on the topic of Eudaimonic Education was held on June 21-22, 2024. The sessions were led by Rev. Overall, the orientation provided valuable insights and practical tools for faculty members, equipping them to create a more fulfilling and effective educational environment.
