- We have successfully organized several seminars and conference, providing platforms for intellectual exchange and professional growth.


 Our staff have actively participated in numerous seminars and workshops, enhancing their knowledge and teaching practices.

Mentor Mentee System




in the pattern of Outcome Based Education with Choice Based Credit System. The board acknowledged and approved the set pattern.

IIC


IIC conducted two programmes this year. An online webinar was conducted on the topic "PoC & Linkage with Innovation Ambassadors" on 15.11.2022. Dr. I. Sankar, Assistant Professor (Senior Grade), Mechanical Engineering, National Engineering College, Kovilpatti was the resource person. A total of 100 students were benefitted.

On 29^h August 2022, Institution's Innovation Council and P.G. and Research Department of English organized a National Webinar on "Process Design and Development" at 4.00 p.m. through Zoom platform. Dr. N. B. Prakash Professor, Dept. of EEE served as the resource person and delivered a lecture. The session focused on the steps of process design and development. The steps in preparing proof of concept includes generating ideas through which we have to understand the outcomes and competitor analysis to explore more about the idea. He further explained the brainstorming process involved in the process of idea creation. He explained the process involved to explore the information collected and create the concept around which a road map should be prepared.

The speaker then explained the concepts of Process Design, with examples from various sectors. He explored the different types of design and the things to be taken into account while designing the ideas with theoretical demonstration to confirm that those concepts are feasible for real world application. He motivated the students to find out the dependencies in the ideas generated and prepare content analysis and then analyze the pros and cons of the idea. A total of 100 students were benefitted through this webinar.









Study Tour

P. G. & Research Department of English organized a Study Tour for the students of III B. A. English Literature (35) and II M. A. English Literature (11) as part of their curriculum. The visit was based on the Post-colonial aspects of literary study and war elements described in Diasporic Literature. Three faculty members escorted the students between 13.04.2023 and 14.03.2023 to Ootacamund. The purpose was to provide practical expose to the students on course namely Diasporic Literature and Post-colonial Writings in English.

Observations:

- 1. The visit to the small pastoral tribal community living in the Nilgiri plateau named Todas offered the students an overview on the lifestyle and cultural perspectives of the pre-British occupants of the hills.
- 2. The Tribal Museum maintained by the aspirants of Providence College for Women, Coonoor was an insightful experience for the students of the coastal area. The wind instrument named Pooheeri was played by the students.
- 3. The visit to the Toda mund helped the students to understand the tribals' spiritual tradition and customs. The architecture of the Toda Hut and shrine showcased their concern in ecological conservation.
- 4. The Madras Regimental Museum provided a realistic war time experience of the past.
- 5. A documentary film on "Training, Sacrifice and Achievement of the Indian Soldiers" screened in the MRC theatre kindled the patriotic spirit of the students.
