Report:

The Department of English (SSC) organized a National Webinar on “Re-reading Keats Psychoanalytically” on 27.05.2020. Mr. Jasvantkumar Valabhai Rathod, Assistant Professor of English, Government Arts and Commerce College, Netrang District, Bharuch, Gujarat addressed the gathering on the psychoanalytical perspectives of Keats and his work. 432 participants from all over India participated in the webinar enthusiastically. 100 participants were accommodated in Zoom meeting and the remaining participants were directed to watch the meeting live streamed in Youtube. The speaker cleared the doubts of the participants in the discussion session at the end of the webinar. We received positive comments from the participants. 76.1% of the participants found the webinar extremely useful and 23% of them found it useful and less than 1% of them found it fair. 64.5% of the participants strongly agreed and 35.3% of them agreed that the webinar met their expectations. 96.8% of the participants found the technology user friendly whereas 3.2% found it not user friendly.
