JACKSON, ASSISTANT PROFESSOR, MIME UMESH FROM TINE SETOOL OF DRAMA (MADURAI), AND V. 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INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR ON "PERCEPTION OF ZOOLOGICAL RESEARCH THROUGH TAMIL LITERATURE'' UNDER THE STAR COLLEGE SCHEME

On 6th September 2024, the Department of Tamil hosted an International Seminar on "Perception of Zoological Research Through Tamil Literature", attended by 310 students. The seminar featured distinguished speakers, including Dr. K. Subbulakshmi, Principal of APC Mahalakshmi College for Women, Dr. K. Raguvaran from BRIN, Indonesia, Dr. B. Ravikumar from Pondicherry University, and Dr. G. Mariappan from Dravidian University. The seminar explored the link between zoological research and Tamil literature, emphasizing how ancient Tamil texts can contribute to understanding biodiversity. The resource persons shared valuable insights on the intersection of *literature and science, enhancing students' perspectives on the relevance* of Tamil literature in contemporary scientific studies. The seminar concluded with an interactive Q&A session, leaving participants with a deeper appreciation of this interdisciplinary field.

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INTERNATIONAL SEMINAR ON "TAMILUM THAVARAMUM" UNDER THE STAR COLLEGE SCHEME

On 10th September 2024, the Department of Tamil, in collaboration with the Marian Star Centre and the Department of Botany, organized an International Seminar on "Tamilum Thavaramum" under the Star College Scheme. The seminar explored the relationship between Tamil literature and environmental themes, focusing on how Tamil cultural expressions contribute to ecological awareness. Distinguished resource persons, including Dr. Muthusamy Ramakrishnan from Nanjing Forestry University, Dr. K. Murugan from Manonmaniam Sundarnar University, and Dr. Hepzi Rose Mary from the University of Kerala, discussed the role of Tamil literature in sustainability, biodiversity, and nature conservation. The seminar offered a platform for interdisciplinary discussions, bridging Tamil heritage with modern environmental science.
